Karlis,

You are receiving this email from me instead of Evan Calhoun as he is out of the office for a few weeks. Thank you for sending this over and allowing TX2 to assist with your permitting needs. As Evan mentioned over the phone, we routinely complete Edwards Aquifer Protection Plan permits for projects within the Contributing and Recharge Zones. We will begin working on a proposal for your project but wanted to discuss scoping with you to ensure we provide you with comprehensive service.

Project Information:

- Address 11301 US Highway 281 North, Spring Branch, TX 78070.
  - 9.52 acres out the 23.801 acres
  - Has the 9.52-acre tract been recorded yet? If so, we would ask for a copy of the recorded deed as TCEQ will require it during the application review process.

Scoping:

WE commonly deal with TCEQ for projects over the Edwards aquifer and can handle that permit. But wanted to make sure you have everything else you need. We understand that another firm has created Civil Engineering plans

and are assuming they are handling other environmental permits. Do you need us to assist with TXDOT or other documents?

Mr. Ercums:

I spoke a few minutes ago with Robert and wanted to pass on information to you relative to the TCEQ Edwards Aquifer Protection Program. Thank you for returning my call.

TCEQ regulates development activities over the Edwards Aquifer which stretches from Bexar to Williamson Counties. Our regulations are at 30 TAC 213, that is Chapter 213 of the Texas Administrative Code. Your proposed site is on the Edwards Aquifer Contributing Zone and will require a Permit prior to your conducting any soil disturbing activity. Since development of the Transfer Station will increase the impervious cover resulting in more rainfall runoff, a stormwater treatment system will be required to remove at least 80% of the increased in total suspended solids (TSS).
